School Context

Tudor Grange Academy Kingshurst (TGAK), is a large school situated in North Solihull, close to the Birmingham border. There are currently 1,143 students in years 7-11 and another 141 in the Sixth Form across 29 ethnicities. Six of the nine localities which make up Kingshurst and Fordbridge are in the 10% most deprived neighbourhoods in the country. The deprivation is mirrored amongst current students at TGAK, as 63% of current students live in IDACI decile one in the 10% most deprived areas across the country, with a further 15% in decile two. In addition to this, 20% of students have a SEND diagnosis, this translates to 250 students As a result the students in our care deserve the very best the school can offer.

Leaders have been ambitious in developing a highly inclusive school with all students attending the academy having access to a broad and balanced curriculum strengthened by being part of a forward-thinking Multi-Academy Trust.

Tudor Grange Academy Kingshurst is an institution that fosters an ethos of working hard and wanting to achieve. As a result, the academy places significant value on the arts, sport, clubs and societies to ensure the whole child is nurtured and cared for. We value our students collectively and individually and acknowledge and celebrate this fact.

I am the Assistant College Leader of Bronte College and a teacher of English at TGAK.

I joined the academy at the start of my teaching career in September 2019 as part of Teach First and gained QTS and a PGDE with within the first two years. I feel like we're listened to and I've really enjoyed taking part in drama club and the outdoor learning opportunities, especially the ropes.




