# **Inclusive Learning Partner**

Traditionally in Primary schools, support staff have either been Learning Support Assistants (LSAs) or Teaching Assistants (TAs).

At Inspiring Primaries Academy Trust, we are breaking new ground to recognise the changed environment that our support staff now work in. The national increase in children with a wide range of additional needs demands that we change how we work. With that in mind, we have created this training opportunity for an Inclusive Learning Partner apprenticeship.

Inclusive Learning Partner Apprentices (ILPAs) will work alongside the classroom teacher to deliver the appropriate bespoke support to children who need it. At times this may be giving one to one support but for the majority of the time they work with small groups of similar learners.

Primarily the role is to ensure that rather than being sidelined or in any way excluded from learning, our children with additional needs access the same challenging curriculum as their peers and make progress in their learning every single day!

## **Our Apprenticeship Pathway**

We have partnered with BeReady, one of the largest delivery partners for apprenticeships in the UK, to provide a fabulous programme that spans two academic years. The core element is a 15 month in-school curriculum which focuses on the professional knowledge, skills and behaviours required of an ILP. These include:

- An overview of each area of SEND including the process from identification of needs through to EHCP and outline of school level support
- How to contribute to the overall ethos and aims of the organisation and promote diversity, inclusion, equality, and acceptance of all learners, including different models of inclusion, concrete examples of differentiation and personalisation in practice
- Understanding how pupils learn and develop including the need to provide feedback to support and facilitate an appropriate level of independence
- Recognise the importance of using appropriate technology to support learning
- Understanding the stages of development for children and young people. Consider the impact of transition on learners and strategies to support them as well as the vulnerability of young people with SEND
- Supporting the development of a stimulating and safe learning environment by developing knowledge of appropriate learning resources and how to adapt communication strategies to suit the audience and context

#### Job Purpose:

- To work with class teachers to plan and deliver effective support & interventions for children who need it.
- To gain increasing knowledge of each individual child and adapt the support offered accordingly.
- To raise standards of pupil attainment and to accelerate pupil progress., with full support from school leadership including the SENDCo.
- To seek out and access professional learning opportunities to improve outcomes for pupils, disseminating learning where appropriate.
- To build positive relationships across the school.
- To be the difference in what our most vulnerable children achieve!

#### Main Duties and Responsibilities related to Teaching & Learning:

- Prepare learning activities to individuals and groups of pupils under the overall direction & supervision of a qualified teacher, differentiating & adapting learning programmes to suit the needs of the allocated pupils.
- Assess, record and report on development, progress and attainment as agreed with the teacher.
- Monitor and record pupil responses and learning achievements, drawing any problems which cannot be resolved to the attention of the teacher.
- Plan and evaluate specialist learning activities with the teacher, writing reports and records as required.
- Select and adapt appropriate resources/methods to facilitate agreed learning activities.
- Support pupils in social and emotional well-being, reporting problems to the teacher as appropriate.

#### Main Duties and Responsibilities related to SEND provision:

- Provide tailored support in one of the four areas of SEND need:
- Communication and interaction
- Cognition and learning
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health difficulties
- Physical and sensory needs
- To work under the direct supervision of the SENDCo, and HLTA where relevant, utilising foundational planning from Class Teachers, to deliver small group or 1-2-1 non core subject sessions with children who have SEND or additional identified needs.
- Be involved in planning, organising and implementing individual development plans for pupils (such as Individual educational plans), & to these plans / EHCP targets for the children in such sessions so that rapid progress is made in those targets being achieved.

#### Main Duties and Responsibilities related to SEND provision (Cont...):

- To take responsibility for pupil performance and behaviour in these sessions, taking direct action as appropriate in line with relevant school policies in order to support learning or to correct unwanted behaviour.
- To prepare and support the use of learning materials taking into account the varying needs of the children being supported.
- To provide care and encouragement to children and young people with disabilities or special educational needs, supporting them to participate in activities and liaising, if required, with parents / carers / other professionals as appropriate.

#### OTHER DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE POST include but are not limited to:

- Establish and maintain relationships with families, carers and other adults, e.g. speech therapists.
- Develop positive working relationships with colleagues & to work effectively as a member of the school & Trust staff team.
- Be responsible for the preparation, maintenance and control of stocks of materials and resources.
- Escort and supervise pupils on educational and out of school activities.
- Guide and support pupils in their personal, emotional and social development.
- Supervise individuals and groups of pupils throughout the day, including supervision in the classroom,playground and dining areas.
- Assist pupils with eating, dressing and hygiene (including toileting), as required, whilst encouraging independence. (only when specific training has been given)
- To help prepare, monitor & maintain a safe & secure learning environment for pupils & staff.
- To prepare and utilise ICT resources to support pupils' learning.
- To support, as appropriate, in instances where pupils are unwell whilst at the school (only when specific training has been given)

#### **Special Factors:**

The postholder may be required to be deployed in any phase within school, including EYFS and Alternative Provisions without prior notice of change of deployment to allow sickness absences and planned absences to be accounted for.

The postholder may be required, with four weeks notice of change of deployment, to work in an alternative school across the Trust for a period of time determined by the needs of the children in that school. For the period of redeployment, the new school will be considered the place of work for the post holder.

The postholder will participate in coordinated training in one of the four main areas of SEND (Cognition & Learning; Social, Emotional & Mental Health; Communication & Interaction and Sensory and/or Physical Difficulties including Autism) with a view to participation in a Trust-wide group of specialists who can support across the Trust's schools. Where possible, this training will be scheduled during working hours but may fall outside of these. A minimum of two weeks notice will be given to ensure attendance.

The postholder will be required to attend, from time to time, additional training courses, conferences, seminars or other meetings as required by his/her own training needs and the needs of the school.

Expenses will be paid in accordance with the Local Conditions of Service.

This post is eligible for a DBS check under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exceptions) Order 1975 (i.e. it involves certain activities in relation to children and/or adults) and defined as regulated activity under Part 1 of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 before the coming into force of section 64 of the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012 on 10th September 2012. Therefore a DBS enhanced check (without a barred list check) is an essential requirement.

Whilst every effort has been made to explain the main duties and responsibilities of the post, each individual task undertaken may not be identified. Employees will be expected to comply with any reasonable request from a manager to undertake work of a similar level that is not specified in this job description.

Inspiring Primaries Academy Trust is seeking to promote the employment of disabled people and will make any adjustments considered reasonable to the above duties under the terms of the Equality Act 2010 to accommodate a suitable disabled candidate.
