Job Description

Main responsibilities: The post-holder will be expected to carry out the following:

- Setting out and clearing away lunchtime tables, cutlery and water

- Supervising wet lunchtimes in classrooms on rainy days
- Following school behaviour management and safeguarding procedures
- Supervise children both in the hall and on the playground to create happy and calm lunchtimes
- Organise and teach children new games and activities for their enjoyment
- To ensure all health & safety procedures are followed

Safeguarding

To be responsible, under the direction of the Head of Academy or another designated teacher, for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of all children within the establishment and to ensure that safeguarding is a priority by following procedures effectively and immediately.
