We are looking for a strong practitioner who has knowledge and understanding to effectively supporting children with communication and interaction difficulties. They will have an understanding of the SEND Code of Practice and the essential processes needed for successful SEND support and inclusion within a primary school and have evidence of continuing professional development relevant to the role.
