



Speech and Language Therapist.

The Speech Language Therapist will provide expertise, advice and intervention for a varied caseload, working both discreetly and embedded within the educational environment across the academy.

Job Purpose

- To assess and manage a Speech & Language Therapist (SALT) caseload using developed clinical skills and innovative practice.
- To identify, assess and manage children with a range of speech and language needs, including Developmental Language Disorder, vocabulary difficulties, speech delay/disorder, and social communication needs, and contribute to a Multi-Agency Assessment Team.
- To identify, assess and diagnose communication needs and select appropriate pupils and types of therapy for communication support.
- To provide expert advice to the Education, Care and Therapy Team in interpreting other professional reports for Admissions, Tribunals, Annual Reviews and Banding.
- To develop and deliver specific training courses relating to speech, language and communication needs.
- To work with parents and carers and children in a supportive and person centred partnership towards agreed goals and outcomes.

Main Duties

- To support and develop the skills of pupils with communication needs arising from autism, social communication needs and/or developmental delays/disorders.
- To implement and monitor a whole academy communication strategy to establish a communication friendly environment.
- To work with a wide range of professionals in a variety of multidisciplinary teams across external agencies in a consultative, advisory and collaborative capacity.
- To provide specialist assessment and analysis of speech and language needs and the impact of this, advising on appropriate intervention.
- To work with the Head of Therapy, Speech and Language colleagues and wider Therapy Team to help ensure that interventions are based on high quality and proven research, leading to evidence based practice.
- To work in partnership with pupils, using high levels of insight, skill and experience, to determine an intervention programme using a holistic pupil centred approach, while working towards a specific therapeutic goal.
