

Tudor Grange Academy, Kingshurst is a 21st century institution, responsive to the needs of the community it serves.

Tudor Grange Academy Kingshurst (TGAK), is a large school situated in North Solihull, close to the Birmingham border. There are currently 1,143 students in years 7-11 and another 141 in the Sixth Form across 29 ethnicities. Six of the nine localities which make up Kingshurst and Fordbridge are in the 10% most deprived neighbourhoods in the country. In addition to this, 20% of students have a SEND diagnosis, this translates to 250 students. As a result the students in our care deserve the very best the school can offer.

Leaders have been ambitious in developing a highly inclusive school with all students attending the academy having access to a broad and balanced curriculum strengthened by being part of a forward-thinking Multi-Academy Trust.

I am the Assistant College Leader of Bronte College and a teacher of English at TGAK.

I joined the academy at the start of my teaching career in September 2019 as part of Teach First and gained QTS and a PGDE with within the first two years. Alongside my training, the CPD programme provided by the academy each year has enabled me to collaborate with colleagues across departments and reflect on my classroom practice. The school's commitment to championing early career teachers and developing staff as leaders has been instrumental in my professional growth and led to my confidence in pursuing a leadership role with the school early into my career. In 2021, I secured the position of Assistant Director of Sixth Form – a role I found incredibly rewarding as I felt I had the opportunity to make a tangible impact on the outcomes of our post-16 students. I really enjoy attending TGAK.


