Faculty Letter Design & Technology

The Design & Technology Faculty consists of nine specialist teachers and three technicians. Within this team there are areas of particular responsibility for the curriculum, under the overall management of the Head of Faculty.

Design and Technology has an important role to play in the lives of our students and they are supported by an excellent D&T team, and the teaching and learning takes place in a wonderful purpose-built environment which has excellent design and make facilities. Our Roll of Honour Board logs the increasing number of students who have achieved excellent exam results and who have chosen to follow a career in design.

Faculty Courses

At Key Stage 3 all pupils study Design and Technology for approximately 2.5 hours/week (i.e. 10% of curriculum time on a 30-period week). A number of projects are delivered in each year group which encourages a multi-disciplinary appreciation of Design and Technology. Throughout the key stage, pupils receive a regular experience of:

- The Design Process
- Graphics/Modelling
- Food and Nutrition
- Textiles Technology

- Resistant Materials
- Systems and Control
- ICT inc. CAD/CAM
- Health and Safety

At Key Stage 4, typically 60%-70% of pupils choose to study one of the following internal D&T endorsements at GCSE (AQA) for 2.5 hours/week in Year 10 and 2 hours/week in Year 11:

- D&T Graphic Products
- D&T Resistant Materials

- Food Preparation & Nutrition
- D&T Textiles

In the 6th Form, each year group of students has the opportunity to follow A Level (AQA) courses in Product Design and Fashion & Textiles or a Post 16 Level 3 course in Food Science & Nutrition.

Accommodation

Due to the growth of Design and Technology at Sheldon School the building of a purpose-built Design and Technology Centre became the cornerstone when developing the Sheldon site to its current capacity.

- To maintain accurate records of students' attendance at lessons and highlight any unusual absence.

- To complete the organisational tasks related to normal teaching duties.
- To liaise with, and set appropriate tasks for, Teaching Assistants allocated to groups or individuals taught.
- To undertake responsibilities appropriate to a main scale teacher within the faculty/ subject area as indicated in this job description.
- To contribute to the schemes of work and the improvement plan for the faculty/subject area.
- To carry out tasks allocated in accordance with the faculty/subject area improvement plan and meet the targets set within the faculty/subject area plan.
- To communicate and consult with parents in accordance with school policy and practice including attendance at parents' evenings and school events.
- To participate in the meetings programme of the school.
- To cover for absent colleagues when called upon, in accordance with school policy and practice within the national guidelines for workforce reform.
