Since joining around 2 years ago I have found KEVICC to be a unique, very fun and supportive place to work.

The children appreciate your support and I feel able to teach in a non-prescribed and independent way that is supported by colleagues within and out of the department. CPD is ongoing and has been at times external which has given a broad range of learning opportunities that have encouraged me to try new strategies in the classroom.

I get the sense of an ethos at KEVICC where kids are allowed to be kids but with the boundaries and rules necessary for learning.

Pupils are encouraged to challenge themselves in and out of the classroom in many ways and I am sure the vast majority of pupils feel very grateful to be at the school.

Since starting at KEVICC in January 2020, I have been warmly welcomed in to the friendly college community and have certainly been made to feel like a valued member of the team.

The support and opportunities I have been given so far in my time at KEVICC have been fantastic.
