About the role...

Main purpose of the role:

- Provide academic support of vulnerable and other pupils to ensure that effective learning takes
 place across the academy in all lessons, enabling all pupils to achieve and exceed their
 academic, social and emotional potential
- Support learning and activities for pupils within our Enhanced Resource Provision, at all stages
 of education, to ensure that pupils are physically, mentally and emotionally able to demonstrate
 resilience and thrive in the school environment
- Work within an SEMH Enhanced Resource Provision and on occasions supporting pupils to transition into mainstream classes
- Offer guidance to teaching staff on strategies to ensure that pupils develop every opportunity fully in the classroom and beyond
- Support pupils around the site both between and during lessons and where appropriate, at break and lunchtime
- Seek out opportunities for pupils to engage in social activities with friendship groups and beyond
- Liaise with parents/carers on a regular basis to highlight areas of concern and celebrate achievement
- Provide targeted support for pupils identified as requiring additional support
- To support pupils who need time out to reflect on their behaviours and find restorative solutions

Key accountabilities:

- Take an active role as a member of staff within The Trust in ensuring that the school is a safe and welcoming environment for all pupils, staff, parents and visitors
- Take a keen interest in continuing professional development of themselves. Ensuring that basic skills relating to their post are continually up to date. Participating in Staff Training Days
- Provide administration support to support the outcomes of the pupils, for example, creating supportive resources, entering incidents through CPOMS, marking assessments
- Be a positive role model and actively engage in the Restorative ethos of the school

- Role model appropriate behaviours within a professional environment including conduct, communication, and personal appearance
- Role model high levels of literacy and numeracy including modelling appropriate language
- Aspire to develop own professional skills and qualifications

- Proven experience of working in a school or educational establishment working with children with special educational needs
- Experience of working unsupervised with individuals or groups of learners
- Motivation to work with children and young people
- Ability to form and maintain appropriate relationships and personal boundaries with children and young people
- Good numeracy/literacy skills
- A knowledge and commitment to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people
- Understanding of relevant polices/codes of practice and awareness of relevant legislation
- General understanding of national/foundation stage curriculum and other basic learning programmes/strategies
- Ability to write coherently and effectively, using expected standard English

Desirable

- Prior experience of working with vulnerable students and those lacking in social skills
- Prior experience of working with challenging students, some of whom have severe behavioural difficulties/social emotional and mental health needs
- Training in the relevant learning strategies e.g. literacy
